

Failure to file a cover sheet with the first paper filed in a civil case may subject a party, its counsel, or both to sanctions under rules 2.30 and 3.220 of the California Rules of Court.

A rule 3.740 collections case will be subject to the requirements for service and obtaining a judgment in rule 3.740.
