

Dear Commissioners,

Please accept these comments in response to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's (FERC) Notice of Intent to Prepare an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the Proposed GTN Xpress Project, Docket No. CP22-2-000. I encourage FERC to strongly consider the no action alternative to GTN's application (i.e., rejecting GTN's shortsighted proposal). In addition, FERC must consider as part of the EIS process:

- *a thorough evaluation of the project's impacts on Tribal Nations and Indigenous people;*
- *environmental justice impacts;*
- *lifecycle greenhouse gas emissions;*
- *the local public health and environmental impacts of gas extraction;*
- *the local public health and environmental impacts of expanding compressor stations;*
- *the public health and safety risks of increasing reliance on fracked gas; and*
- *the impact the expansion project will have on Oregon and Washington's legislatively mandated effort to replace fossil fuel generated electricity with clean energy options.*

The future of communities disproportionately impacted by the gas industry and our climate depends on an environmental review that thoroughly considers the project's wide-ranging impacts and recommends the "no action" alternative.
