MINUTE entry before the Honorable Maria Valdez: Plaintiffs' Amended Motion to Extend the Fact Discovery Deadline and to Increase the Number of Depositions Permitted Under Fed. R. Civ. P. 30(a)(2) [440] [441] is granted. The Court finds that there is good cause to extend the existing discovery deadline. The Court enters the following modified discovery schedule: the parties shall serve written fact discovery and third-party subpoenas for documents by 10/1/22; the parties are to complete all document productions by 11/15/22; all written and oral fact discovery shall be completed by 12/23/22; and requests for admission must be served in time for the answers to become due on or before the 12/23/22 discovery cutoff.
