In accordance with subsection (j) of Section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337) ("Section 337"), and the July 21, 2005, Memorandum for the United States Trade Representative (70 Fed. Reg. 43251), I am transmitting to you and the United States Trade Representative copies of the Commission's limited exclusion order and a cease and desist order, as described below, and the record upon which the Commission based its determination.

On October 26, 2023, the United States International Trade Commission issued a limited exclusion order and a cease-and-desist order pursuant to Section 337 in USITC Investigation No. 337-TA-1276, *Certain Light-Based Physiological Measurement Devices and Components Thereof.* The limited exclusion order prohibits respondent Apple, Inc. of Cupertino, California from importing into the United States light-based physiological measurement devices and components thereof that infringe one or more of claims 22 and 28 of U.S. Patent No. 10,912,502 and claims 12, 24, and 30 of U.S. Patent No. 10,945,648 ("covered products"). The cease-and-desist order prohibits respondent Apple, Inc. from further importing, selling, and distributing the covered products in the United States.

The Commission concluded that the statutory public interest factors in subsections (d)(1)

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and (f)(1) of Section 337 do not preclude the issuance of this remedy.
