Dear Mr. Davis:

The Commission is in receipt of your November 2, 2023, letter requesting a postponement of the deadline by which the Commission must decide whether to institute a Section 337 investigation based on the above-referenced complaint.

Under Commission Rule 210.10(a)(1), 19 C.F.R. § 210.10(a)(1), the Commission may extend the 30-day deadline for voting on institution of an investigation based upon a request by complainant that the Commission extend the deadline. Rule 210.10(a)(4) authorizes the Commission to reschedule the determination on institution "for whatever date is appropriate in light of the facts." 19 C.F.R. § 210.10(a)(4).

Your letter requests an extension of the vote on institution "due in part to the belated submission from U.S. Customs and Border Protection ('CBP') that was received yesterday, November 1, 2023. Complainants intend to address CBP's submission and file a response no later than November 6, 2023." In view of this request, the Commission has determined to postpone the vote on institution until November 21, 2023.
