- 6. Status of any proceedings (including reexamination proceedings) before the United States Patent and Trademark Office;
- 7. Proposal for any modifications of the protective order (Order No. 1) now in effect for this investigation;
- 8. Position as to whether a Markman hearing would be beneficial; and
- 9. Position as to target date.
