6	proceeding IPR 2014-00527 involving U.S. Patent 7,496,674.
7	I would like to start by apologizing for the delay.

5	JUDGE COCKS: Thank you, Mr. Hart. All right.
6	As we set forth in the trial hearing order, each side
7	has 60 minutes to present their case. The Petitioner bears the
8	burden of showing unpatentability, so proceeds first. You may
9	reserve rebuttal time. Patent Owner will give their
10	presentation and the Petitioner will conclude. So that being
11	said, the argument begins when you are all ready.
12	MR. GOKHALE: Thank you.
13	I have some exhibits, if I may provide them.
14	JUDGE COCKS: Yes, you may.
15	MR. GOKHALE: I would like to reserve 20

20	We filed a petition against U.S. Patent 7,496,674. Given the
21	number of, the number of grounds of rejection in this case, I
22	just want to cut right to the issues.
23	The first ground of rejection that we have presented
24	was based on the reference Stadler, et al. It is directed to a
25	gateway between a wired network and a wireless network.

1	There are a couple main issues that the Patent
2	Owners have presented with regards to the Stadler reference in
3	difference to the independent claims. And I am going to use
4	independent claim 1 as sort of the exemplary claim I am going
5	to be talking about during this hearing.
6	Now, the Stadler reference describes, if you look at
7	our Exhibits, 1003, it shows a picture 274. Sorry, figure 2 on
8	page 274.
9	And what this figure depicts is that a fixed user is
10	communicating with a remote user. In the path of
11	communication, there is a satellite link. Stadler describes
12	using a WISE gateway at the boundaries at the satellite link.
13	So the fixed user sends a packet of data destined
14	for a remote user. It will be received by the WISE gateway.
15	JUDGE COCKS: Counsel, may I interrupt? Are we
16	looking at a page of your demonstrative? Is that what you have
17	directed us to?
18	MR. GOKHALE: It is Exhibit 1003, Stadler.
19	JUDGE COCKS: So the demonstratives have a
20	particular page number itself?
21	MR. GOKHALE: There is tabs in the binder.
22	JUDGE COCKS: Okay, thank you.
23	MR. GOKHALE: And it is figure 2 shown on page
24	274 of Stadler.
25	JUDGE COCKS: Please proceed.
