DECISION

Motion for *Pro Hac Vice* Admission of Anita Binayi-Ghiam
37 C.F.R. § 42.10

As authorized by the Notice of Filing Date Accorded to Petition (Paper 4), Patent Owner, Società Italiana Per Lo Sviluppo Dell'Elettronica S.p.A., filed a Motion for *Pro Hac Vice* Admission of Anita Binayi-Ghiam (“Motion,” Paper 6).¹ Petitioner, Unified Patents Inc., did not oppose the Motion. The Motion is *granted*. See 37 C.F.R. § 42.10(c); see also IPR2013-00639, Paper 7 (setting forth requirements for *pro hac vice* admission).²

It is

ORDERED that the Motion seeking admission *pro hac vice* for Anita Binayi-Ghiam is *granted*;

FURTHER ORDERED that Anita Binayi-Ghiam may not act as lead counsel in the proceeding;

FURTHER ORDERED that a registered practitioner must remain as lead counsel throughout the proceeding;

FURTHER ORDERED that Anita Binayi-Ghiam is to comply with the Office Patent Trial Practice Guide and the Board’s Rules of Practice for Trials, as set forth in Part 42 of the C.F.R.; and

FURTHER ORDERED that Anita Binayi-Ghiam is to be subject to the Office’s disciplinary jurisdiction under 37 C.F.R. § 11.19(a), and the
