The above-entitled matter came on for hearing on April 10, 2018, commencing at 1:00 p.m. at the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office, Madison Building, 600 Dulany Street, Alexandria, Virginia 22314.

1	PROCEEDINGS
2	JUDGE MELVIN: Okay. Good afternoon, everyone.
3	This is the hearing in IPR2017-00610 between Petitioner,
4	LivePerson, Incorporated and Patent Owner, 24/7 Customer
5	Incorporated. We're reviewing patent number 9,077,804.
6	I'm Judge Melvin, with me is Judge Weinschenk and
7	Judge Crumbley is appearing remotely.
8	Let's get the parties' appearances, please. For
9	Petitioner?
10	MR. ALPER: Yes, your Honor. Adam Alper from
11	Kirkland and Ellis for Petitioner.
12	MR. MILLER: Good afternoon. Mark Miller of
13	O'Melveny and Myers for the Patent Owner, 24/7.
14	JUDGE MELVIN: Thank you and welcome. We appreciate
15	you appearing here today and helping us understand your
16	arguments. We look forward to your presentations.
17	I'd like to cover a couple of preliminary issues
18	before we begin. First, on Friday, Patent Owner filed a
19	motion for pro hac vice admission. Is that something you'd
20	like us to address right now?
21	MR. MILLER: I don't believe that it is necessary
22	to
23	JUDGE MELVIN: Okay.
24	MR. MILLER: (Inaudible) time today.
25	JUDGE MELVIN: Okay. That's fine.
26	And the second item is a possible motion to exclude.

1	We know Patent Owner filed objections in Paper 29 and
2	Petitioner filed an opposition to a motion to exclude in
3	Paper 33. And Patent Owner filed a reply in Paper 34, but
4	the record does not appear to contain the motion filed by
5	Patent Owner.
6	So we suspected that perhaps a motion was served,
7	but not filed, but maybe counsel for Patent Owner would
8	comment on that?
9	MR. MILLER: Your Honor, our intention was certainly
10	to file a motion to exclude which I thought we had filed.
11	JUDGE MELVIN: Okay.
12	MR. MILLER: We will check the record
13	JUDGE MELVIN: If you could check into and, you
14	know, we'll address it somehow. I mean, obviously Petitioner
15	had notice and you know, we're all sort of operating as if
16	there is such a motion, but we certainly need it to be in the
17	record.
18	MR. MILLER: And you're referring to the motion to
19	exclude?
20	JUDGE MELVIN: Correct.
21	Okay. So today each party will have 30 minutes of
22	total time to present arguments. Petitioner will start.
23	Please keep in mind that Judge Crumbley cannot see
24	the screen in this room so please refer to an exhibit or
25	slide number for his benefit and for a clear record. Also
26	remember that he can only hear you if you speak into the

1 microphone. 2 Please do not interrupt the other party. You may 3 object after that party's presentation if you need to. 4 Petitioner, how much time would you like to reserve for rebuttal? 5 6 MR. ALPER: Your Honor, I'd like to attempt to 7 reserve ten minutes. JUDGE MELVIN: Okay. And with that, we're ready 8 9 when you are. 10 MR. ALPER: Thank you, your Honors. 11 JUDGE MELVIN: And just before you begin, I'll set 12 the timer for 20 minutes so when you see the light, that will 13 mean you're into rebuttal. 14 MR. ALPER: Thank you very much, your Honors. 15 Good afternoon, your Honors. I am Adam Alper from 16 Kirkland for Petitioner, LivePerson. I'd like to of course 17 focus my comments on ground one. That is the ground that's 18 directed to the independent claims of the 804 patent and is 19 the only ground where there are disputes raised by 24/7. 20 And if we can go to slide 11, I've laid out the 21 independent claims of my presentation. 22 And by the way, I will be -- I'll be jumping around a little bit around in the slides, but I'll try to call out 23 24 the slide numbers so that way it's easy to follow.
