4	JUDGE MEDLEY: Good afternoon. This is the hearing for
5	IPR2017-01131 and IPR2017-01133, Twitter v. Vidstream. We would like
6	parties to please introduce counsel at this time beginning with Petitioner.
7	MR. SIEGEL: Todd Siegel from Klarquist Sparkman for
8	Petitioner, and with me is Rob Cruzen from Klarquist Sparkman as well.
9	JUDGE BOUDREAU: Could you please step up to the
10	microphone? We can't hear you.
11	JUDGE MEDLEY: Oh. Sorry, yes, you have to step up to the
12	JUDGE BOUDREAU: Thank you.
13	MR. SIEGEL: Todd Siegel from Klarquist Sparkman for Petitioner,
14	Twitter.
15	JUDGE BOUDREAU: Thank you.
16	MR. CRUZEN: And Robert Cruzen from Klarquist Sparkman also
17	for Petitioner, Twitter.
18	JUDGE MEDLEY: And who will be representing or speaking
19	today?
20	MR. CRUZEN: I, Robert Cruzen, will be speaking as to the 1131
21	petition, and Mr. Siegel as to the 1133 petition.
22	JUDGE MEDLEY: Okay. Thank you. And for Patent Owner?
23	MR. ROBINSON: Eagle Robinson here for Patent Owner, Your
24	Honor. With me is Mr. Eric Green. I will be presenting.



1	JUDGE MEDLEY: Okay. Thank you.
2	MR. SIEGEL: Your Honor, excuse me. As a preliminary, we
3	JUDGE MEDLEY: You need to go to the microphone, I'm sorry,
4	you have to go back to the podium
5	MR. SIEGEL: I'm sorry.
6	JUDGE MEDLEY: because the other two can't hear you if
7	you're not at the podium.
8	MR. SIEGEL: It seems as though we haven't had a chance to get
9	this working, our slide deck. I'm not sure what the the last time I was
10	here, it worked fine. So, I'm not sure if we have any
11	JUDGE MEDLEY: Well, we have copies of your demonstratives.
12	MR. SIEGEL: Okay.
13	JUDGE MEDLEY: So, if everyone is okay with that, we can just -
14	you can just go through your slide deck and just let us know which slide
15	you're on and we can follow along with you.
16	MR. SIEGEL: Sure. Sorry about that.
17	JUDGE MEDLEY: Okay. No problems.
18	All right. Each party has 60 minutes total time to present
19	arguments. Petitioner, you'll proceed first to present your case with respect
20	to the challenged claims and grounds, for which we instituted, and you may
21	reserve some of your argument time to respond to arguments presented by
22	Patent Owner.
23	Thereafter, Patent Owner will respond to Petitioner's presentation
24	and reserve argument time for sur-rebuttal.



1	Are there any questions as to the order of presentations?
2	MR. CRUZEN: No, Your Honor.
3	JUDGE MEDLEY: Okay. No?
4	MR. ROBINSON: Not for Patent Owner, Your Honor.
5	JUDGE MEDLEY: Okay. Petitioner, do you want to reserve
6	time for rebuttal, and how much?
7	MR. CRUZEN: Yes, Your Honor. 20 minutes, please.
8	JUDGE MEDLEY: Okay. And Patent Owner, Mr. Robinson?
9	MR. ROBINSON: Ten minutes, please.
10	JUDGE MEDLEY: Ten minutes. Okay. We'd like to remind
11	the parties that the hearing is open to the public and the transcript will be
12	entered into public record and these proceedings.
13	And also, as we spoke earlier in a previous hearing, we did not
14	receive Patent Owner's demonstratives uploaded into the record; so, we
15	understand that by Tuesday you will file those?
16	MR. ROBINSON: Yes, Your Honor.
17	JUDGE MEDLEY: Okay. Thank you. Petitioner, you may
18	proceed.
19	MR. CRUZEN: Thank you, Your Honor. And it does appear that
20	the HDMI is now working, so slides are on the screen.
21	So, I'm Robert Cruzen presenting for Petitioner, and I will be
22	speaking as to the 304 patent in the 1131 petition; and Mr. Siegel will be
23	speaking as to the 1133 petition.



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
