P R O C E E D I N G S

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JUDGE GIANNETTI: So, let's get started. First of all, welcome to everyone.

We are here for a final hearing in IPR2017-02012, Fitbit v. Blackbird Tech, LLC. In this hearing, we also will be addressing a joined case, IPR2018-00275, Wahoo Fitness v. Blackbird Tech.

So, let me start by introducing the panel. I'm Judge Giannetti. I will be presiding today. And on the monitors to my left and to my right are my colleagues, Judge Zado and Judge Stephens, who are participating in this hearing remotely today.

Let me, next, get the appearances of counsel. Who's appearing today for Petitioner?

MR. BATTS: Good afternoon, Your Honors. Harper Batts from the Law Firm of Sheppard Mullin is representing the Petitioner. As to the grounds that we are addressing today, I will split my argument with my colleague, Mr. Ponder, if the panel wishes to hear any of the constitutionality or SAS-related issues. Otherwise, we don't mind addressing them more.

JUDGE GIANNETTI: Well, I will leave that up to you, but I think I speak for the panel when I say we are more interested in hearing about the merits of the case today.

MR. BATTS: Right. Thank you.

JUDGE GIANNETTI: All right. Mr. Davis, you're appearing again today?

1 MR. DAVIS: Yes, Your Honor. Good to see you again.

2 JUDGE GIANNETTI: All right.

3 MR. DAVIS: Good afternoon. Walter Davis from Davidson  
4 Berquist Jackson & Gowdey on behalf of patent owner Blackbird. With me  
5 today is Aldo Noto.

6 JUDGE GIANNETTI: All right. Thank you very much.

7 All right. So, let me just go over some of the procedures we're going  
8 to be following today. Each side has 60 minutes to present argument.  
9 Petitioner may reserve time for rebuttal. I assume that both of you will be  
10 using demonstratives. Both sides will be using demonstratives today. We  
11 have copies of those, and our remote judges also have them.

12 I will point out that demonstratives are not evidence in this case. If  
13 you want to have something be on the record during this procedure, you  
14 should make it part of the oral record and not rely on the demonstratives.  
15 They are aids to argument and not evidence.

16 And while we're on the subject of demonstratives, please be careful  
17 when you are using demonstratives, to point out what slide number you are  
18 referring to. Our remote judges have the demonstratives and can follow  
19 along, but you have to give them the number, so that they can do that.

20 Finally, we have been having some microphone problems here. So,  
21 make sure that, when you speak, you are close to the microphones, so that  
22 not only can I hear you, but also the remote judges.

23 Any questions before we get into this? Mr. Batts? Is it Batts?

24 MR. BATTS: Batts.

1 No, Your Honor.

2 JUDGE GIANNETTI: Batts?

3 MR. BATTS: Mr. Batts, and no questions, Your Honor.

4 JUDGE GIANNETTI: Okay, Mr. Batts.

5 And, Mr. Davis, any questions?

6 MR. DAVIS: No, Your Honor.

7 JUDGE GIANNETTI: All right. Let me just set the clock here. Do  
8 you want rebuttal time, Mr. Batts?

9 MR. BATTS: Yes, I'd like to reserve 20 minutes, please.

10 JUDGE GIANNETTI: Twenty minutes, okay.

11 MR. BATTS: May I approach with a copy of the demonstratives?

12 JUDGE GIANNETTI: That's fine. You may hand those up. We  
13 already have copies, but this is helpful. Thank you.

14 All right. Let me just take a minute to set the clock.

15 All right, Mr. Batts, you may proceed whenever you're ready.

16 STATEMENT ON BEHALF OF PETITIONER

17 MR. BATTS: Thank you, Your Honor.

18 I just want to confirm, good afternoon and good morning.

19 Judge Stephens and Judge Zado, can you hear me?

20 JUDGE STEPHENS: Yes. Yes, I can.

21 JUDGE ZADO: I can hear you as well. Thank you.

22 JUDGE GIANNETTI: Okay. We're off to a good start.

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
