DECISION  
Termination of the Proceeding  
*37 C.F.R. §§ 42.72, 42.74*

## I. INTRODUCTION

The parties filed a Joint Motion to Terminate Proceedings. Paper 16 (“Motion” or “Mot.”). The parties also filed what they indicate is a true and correct copy of a Confidential Agreement. Ex. 2002 (“Agreement”). In a Joint Request, the parties identified the Agreement as business confidential information and requested that the Agreement be kept separate from the patent file. Paper 17 (“Joint Request”). For the reasons discussed below, the Motion and Joint Request are *granted*.

## II. ANALYSIS

We have not decided the merits of this proceeding. The parties indicate that they have settled their dispute regarding U.S. Patent No. 6,397,186 B1. Mot. 1. The parties filed the Agreement, and represent that “there are no collateral agreements or understandings between the parties made in connection with, or in contemplation of, the termination of this proceeding.” *Id.* Under these circumstances, we determine that it is appropriate to terminate this proceeding. *See* 37 C.F.R. §§ 42.72. We also determine that it is appropriate to treat the Agreement as business confidential information to be kept separate from the patent file. *See* 37 C.F.R. § 42.74(c).

## III. ORDER

In consideration of the foregoing, it is hereby:

ORDERED that the Joint Motion to Terminate Proceedings is *granted*;

FURTHER ORDERED that this proceeding is *terminated* as to all parties; and
