The above-entitled matter came on for hearing on Wednesday,
November 3, 2021, commencing at 1:00 p.m. EST, by video/by telephone.

PROCEEDINGS

JUDGE MEDLEY: Okay. We're on the record.

Good afternoon, everyone. This is the hearing for --

MR. MICALLEF: Good afternoon.

JUDGE MEDLEY: -- IPR -- good afternoon -- for
2020-01413, between Petitioner, Lenovo Holding Company,
Lenovo (United States) Inc., and Motorola, and Patent
Owner, InterDigital Technology Corporation, involving U.S.
Patent No. 8,199,726.

I am Judge Medley, and with me are Judges Quinn
and Sawert.

At this time, we'd like the parties to please
introduce counsel for the record beginning with the
Petitioner.

MR. MICALLEF: Thank you, Your Honor. This is
Joe Micallef with Sidley Austin for the Petitioners. With
me to my right is my associate, Kyle Smith, who will be
making part of the argument pursuant to the Leap Program.
And on the phone is my partner, Scott Border.

JUDGE MEDLEY: Okay. Thank you.

And for Patent Owner.

MR. ARGENTI: Hello, Your Honor. Matt Argenti
from Wilson Sonsini on behalf of Patent Owner,
InterDigital. And also on the audio line are my
co-counsel, Mike Rosato, as well as colleagues from my

1 firm, Wes Derryberry and Patrick Medley, and a number of
2 representatives from InterDigital.

3 JUDGE MEDLEY: Great. Thank you very much.

4 Since Mr. Smith is authorized to argue as a Leap
5 Practitioner, Petitioner is granted an additional 15
6 minutes of oral argument time. Accordingly, Petitioner
7 will have 75 minutes to present arguments, and Patent
8 Owner will have 60 minutes to present arguments.

9 So Petitioner, you will proceed first, and you
10 may reserve some of your argument time to respond to
11 arguments presented by Patent Owner. Thereafter, Patent
12 Owner will respond to Petitioners' presentation and may
13 reserve argument time for surrebuttal.

14 So Petitioners' Counsel, would you -- do you wish
15 to reserve some of your time to respond?

16 MR. MICALLEF: I would, Your Honor. I would like
17 to reserve 30 minutes.

18 JUDGE MEDLEY: 30 minutes. All right.

19 And Counsel for Patent Owner, do you wish to
20 reserve some of your time?

21 MR. ARGENTI: 15 minutes, please, Your Honor.

22 JUDGE MEDLEY: Okay. All right. Let me -- any
23 questions before we begin?

24 I think both of you have been before us before,
25 and have argued under these circumstances, so I think you

1 know the drill. Just remember to mute yourself if you're
2 not speaking, okay. And also to let us know which slide
3 you're referring to when you speak, and any other exhibits
4 or papers that you refer to before you get into them.

5 All right. So we're ready to begin.

6 Petitioner, when you're ready.

7 MR. MICALLEF: Thank you, Your Honor. Joe
8 Micallef.

9 First I would like to thank the Panel for
10 permitting Mr. Smith to argue under the Leap Program, and
11 for the extra time. How we propose to do this is I'm
12 going to begin this argument, do an overview of the patent
13 and the prior art, and I will address the claim
14 construction disputes between the parties. And then, I
15 will turn it over to Mr. Smith, and I will let him deal
16 with the remaining issues to be debated.

17 So if I can direct your attention to our
18 demonstratives. I have a number of them. I likely will
19 not refer to all of them. I may jump around a little, but
20 I'm happy to answer questions from the Panel about any of
21 them.

22 I guess I would direct your attention to begin
23 with to Slide 2, which is just a listing of the grounds in
24 this proceeding. All of the grounds here are based on --
25 oops. Something is going wrong -- wrong with our camera.

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
