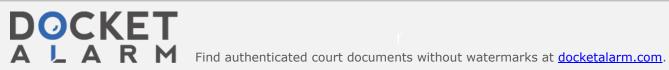
DECLARATION OF VIJAY K. MADISETTI, PH.D.
