PETITION FOR OCCUPATIONAL DRIVER'S LICENSE

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

Now comes JOSHUA KANE WEST, Petitioner, and petitions the Court for an occupational driver's license under the provisions of § 521.242 of the Texas Transportation Code, and in support thereof would respectfully show this Honorable Court the following:

1. Petitioner's license is currently suspended due a Driving While Intoxicated arrest on December 16, 2017.
2. There is an essential need for Petitioner to operate a motor vehicle:
 - a. to perform Petitioner's occupation or trade;
 - b. for transportation to and from where Petitioner practices an occupation or trade; and
 - c. to perform duties essential to the maintenance of a family household, on the following days and times, to-wit:

Days and Times

- Monday: 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- Tuesday: 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- Wednesday: 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- Thursday: 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- Friday: 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- Saturday: 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- Sunday: 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

3. In the event of a material change in circumstances affecting one or more of the essential needs outlined hereinabove, which may necessitate the operation of a motor vehicle by Petitioner outside of the date and time intervals requested, Petitioner requests the Court permit Petitioner to operate a motor vehicle a maximum of twelve hours in any twenty-four hour

consecutive period, provided that Petitioner maintains at all times, a Deputy Clerk, Erika Salinas, as follows:
Petitioner's purpose, destination, the date, time of departure, and time of arrival.

4. There is an essential need for Petitioner to operate a motor vehicle in and throughout the following Texas counties:

Counties

Newton, Jasper, Orange, Polk, Jefferson, Hardin, Liberty, Montgomery, Walker, San Jacinto, Harris, Waller, Austin, Fort Bend, Brazoria, Galveston, Chambers, Grimes, Brazos, Washington, Austin, Colorado, Wharton, Matagorda, Lavaca, Jackson, Sabine, Dewitt, Victoria, Calhoun, Goliad, Refugio, Aransas, Bee, Live Oak, San Patricio, Duvall, Wells, Nueces, Jim Hogg, Brooks, Kennedy, Kleberg, Webb, Duvall, Zapata, Starr, Hidalgo, Willacy, and Cameron

5. It is necessary for Petitioner to operate a vehicle for more than four hours in a twenty-four-hour period, therefore, Petitioner requests the Court to grant a waiver of the four hour operating period restriction of §421.248(b) of the Texas Transportation Code.

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner prays that he be granted the privilege to drive a motor vehicle to perform Petitioner's occupation or trade; for transportation to and from where Petitioner practices an occupation or trade; for transportation to and from an educational facility in which Petitioner is enrolled; and to perform duties essential to the maintenance of a family household, under such restrictions as the Court may determine.
